The workshop incorporates both theory and practice to engage and intervene with such individuals.



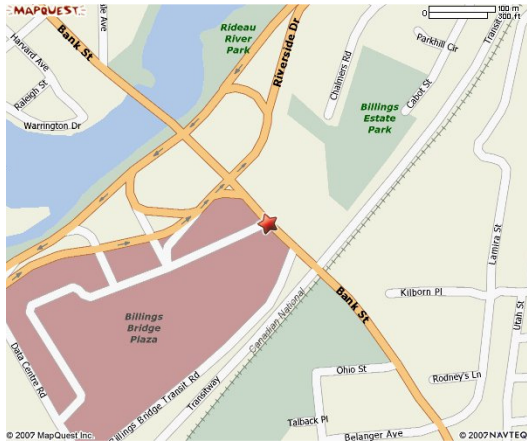
